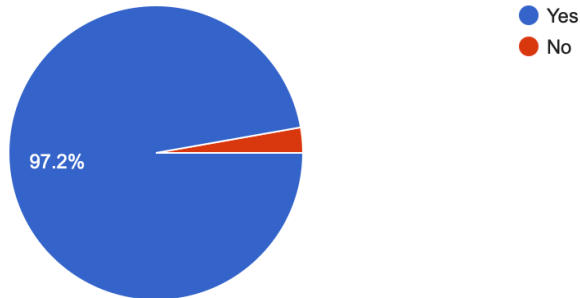

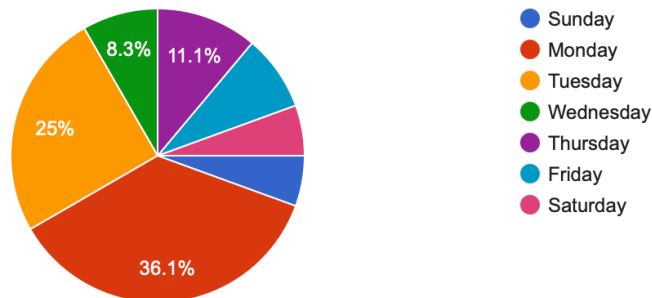

With shrinking congregation sizes, smaller numbers of individuals entering ministry careers, where do our future preachers come from? What about women's participation in services, leading parts of public worship, serving as ministers, deacons or elders - scripture, tradition, and pressure from today's society, perhaps as embodied in secular education? Where does the idea of a 'sanctuary' come from within the church, are buildings or parts of buildings consecrated?
